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ABOUT FIBA

The International Basketball Federation (FIBA), the world governing body for the sport, was originally founded by eight nations in 1932 and now brings together 213 National Basketball Federations worldwide.

The mission of FIBA, which is a non-profit making organization, is to unite the 450 million basketball players and fans globally, by developing and promoting the sport. It is the only authority in basketball recognized by the International Olympic Committee (IOC). Its main office is located at the Patrick Baumann House of Basketball, in Mies, Switzerland, with the headquarters supported by Regional Offices in Africa, Americas, Asia, Europe and Oceania.

In its primary role of developing and promoting basketball around the world, FIBA oversees: the establishment, updating and amending of the Official Basketball Rules; the establishment of the specifications for basketball equipment and facilities; the establishment of all regulations for international and Olympic competitions, including the system of competition; appointing international referees; regulating the transfer of players from one country to another; as well as governing and overseeing the organization of all international competitions.

FIBA's main tournaments are the FIBA Basketball World Cup and the FIBA Women's Basketball World Cup, which are held every four years. These tournaments are underpinned by prestigious youth events for both men and women, in the form of the FIBA U19 Basketball World Cup and the FIBA U17 Basketball World Cup, with each edition being held every two years. There are also multiple Continental events at both senior and youth level.

Also, overseeing the Olympic Basketball Tournaments for Men and Women as well as the Olympic Qualifying Tournaments, FIBA continues to secure the promotion and ever increasing global development of 3x3 basketball via a variety of competitions worldwide. At the re-scheduled Tokyo 2020 Games, 3x3 basketball will also debut as an Olympic discipline.

To facilitate this, we need to make sure we understand all our most fundamental processes – including player movements.

The monitoring of this continues to be enhanced by our investment in technology and specifically the transformative FIBA Management and Administrative Platform (MAP). This is our central information system that is used to prepare and support all aspects of FIBA competitions.

Also, with this latest edition of the report, we are thankful to be able to celebrate another successful collaboration between FIBA and the International Centre for Sport Studies (CIES). Both organizations continue to combine our collective knowledge and data on international transfers, harnessing the expertise of the CIES Sports Observatory.

Finally, I would like to take this opportunity to sincerely thank all FIBA and CIES collaborators who contributed to producing this valuable resource – something which is now at the disposal of the world basketball community.


SAMPLE AND METHODOLOGY

Two main sources of data have been utilized in this report, including FIBA's database of all men's and women's international transfers. This records all movements completed by players who are aged 18 and older between two respective National Federations; which has required a 'Letter of Clearance' to be issued by the Federation of origin to the Federation of destination. For the 2019-20 season, 8 900 transfers were recorded involving a total of 7 371 players. The latter figure is in respect to international transfers of both professional and amateur players - male or female.

The second source is FIBA's database of all players registered in 16 of the top division men's leagues globally (see map). In order to be eligible for inclusion in the statistics, players must have played at least once during the 2019-20 season and the total sample included 3 778 players. The performance and demographic indicators for each league can be compared between one another.

Our analysis focuses intensely on three specific points: a comparison between national players and foreigners (players who have at least one nationality which is different than that of the country in which they play), U21 players and the turnover of players, plus the origin of imported players and a comparison of their profile with that of national players.

An analysis on International Players has also been undertaken for the United States based competitions (NBA, WNBA, NCAA Men, NCAA Women) and European competitions (EuroLeague, Basketball Champions League, EuroLeague Women and EuroCup Women).

HIGHLIGHTS

A record number of international transfers

The highest ever number of international transfers was recorded, with a deeper analysis showing that there were more players involved in transfers (+489). This suggests that due to economic uncertainties, most clubs mainly preferred to keep faith in their original player choices, rather than looking to change. This is highlighted across the main leagues, with a higher percentage of players staying in country and with club (pages 30-31), with only Spain seeing a decrease.

The Europe Region witnessed a record 4 538 international transfers. This represents more than half of all transfers during the 2019-20 season and can be emphasized further via the percentage of foreigners who played in European Leagues (pages 26-27).

USA remained the biggest exporter and players still don't hesitate in moving between Continents to pursue better opportunities. The balance of national exports/imports clearly demonstrates this trend (pages 14-15).

Less number of games played and a high number of international players

There was a big decrease in the number of games played due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Indeed, only 203 games were played during the 2019-20 season – compared to 260 during 2018-19. Only China, Germany, Israel and Spain finished their respective 2019-20 campaigns with a Regular Season and Playoffs, while Australia almost managed the same feat, completing three games in the best of five NBL Finals series.

The number of foreign players within national leagues and the diversity of those nationalities remained high. Out of 16 leagues, a total of 6 had more foreign than national players. Spain remains the league with the highest percentage of foreign players and the highest number of nationalities.

In contrast, China had the lowest share of international players with just 20.6% and was one of the lowest leagues with the number of different nationalities.

In general, the playing time of international players is still high in leagues and this underlines the notion that the prevalence of foreign players limits the development of national players.

Limited development opportunities within leagues for National U21 players

The 2019-20 season witnessed little movement in terms of the percentage of national U21 players and their respective playing time, which remained broadly similar to 2018-19.

The COVID-19 pandemic and its impact on the NBA, NBA G League and WNBA

The NBA decided to resume its season in an isolated environment called the 'NBA Bubble'. A total of 22 clubs were invited to participate with games being held behind closed doors between July and October 2020.





The NBA recorded a significant drop of inward transfers to just 34 from 137. This is the lowest number since the 2006-07 season and the main reason was the cancellation of the 2020 NBA Summer league.

Additionally, the globalisation of basketball might be having a major impact on these numbers and reasons could include: the number of international players in the NCAA seeing the highest number ever recorded, with more than 1 350 international players across both men and women. Meanwhile the development of the NBA G League has led to more teams, better contracts and an increased opportunity for players to join an NBA team.

The WNBA and NBA G League also witnessed a decrease in both inward and outward transfers.

Stabilization in the number of international players in the NBA

The percentage of international players and US players remained similar to the previous season, with only a slight decrease of US players from 418 to 414.

The average number of games for international players decreased due to the COVID-19 pandemic when the NBA decided to shorten the season. However, the average number of minutes they consumed remained the same as 2018-19.

More international players were selected in the 2019 NBA Draft, with 9 players picked in the First Round and another 9 players chosen in the Second Round. Since 83% of these players went on to participate in the NBA, it represented the highest ever percentage.

European Leagues

The USA remained the most represented nationality across European Leagues and this was strongly reflected by the average minutes and points per game accumulated. Yet there was also more playing time obtained by national (domestic) players during the season.

While EuroCup Women did not see any significant changes, there was a notable increase in the percentage of National U21 players competing in EuroLeague Women, which moved upwards from 7.5% to 13.7%.

However, both leagues are still relying heavily on US players, with the average number of minutes and points per game remaining higher than those of the national (domestic) players.


The number of international transfers during the 2019-20 season was the highest number ever recorded at 8 900. A total of 7371 players were involved in one (or more) international transfers.


Except for the Americas, all FIBA Regions saw increased numbers of international transfers. The most notable change was identified in the Europe Region, which witnessed an increase from 3 971 to 4 538.

There was only a minor change in respect of the frequency of international transfers, with COVID-19 only having a small impact.

The average age profile for both men and women remained stable.

EVOLUTION OF INTERNATIONAL TRANSFERS












AGE OF TRANSFERRED PLAYERS




FREQUENCY OF INTERNATIONAL TRANSFERS By Player (2019-20)

MIGRATORY BALANCE



The migratory balance in the Europe Region remained negative (more imports than exports), with imports growing each year. There was a particularly notable increase in the 2019-20 season from 1 157 to 1 610.

In contrast, the Americas had the same turnover, but with a positive balance (more exports than imports). Meanwhile Africa, Oceania and Asia remained stable (a neutral balance).

The Americas Region is the biggest exporter of players, with USA, Canada, Argentina and Venezuela the leading exporter countries.

The top ten leading importer countries were all from Europe, which remained as the biggest importer Region. Seven nations were located in Western Europe, while Germany and Spain continued to be the biggest importers since 2017.










While the top ten networks remained stable, the numbers for 2019-20 did show an overall decrease. This was especially the case in the USA-Spain and USA-Australia networks.

The biggest network outside of the USA and Europe was between Puerto Rico and Mexico. The reason for this is both proximity and the similar level of competition.


Meanwhile due to the ease of travel and geographical proximity, flows within Europe have remained stable, with France, Germany, Italy and Spain remaining as the top countries.

International Transfers

USA LEAGUES

There was a dramatic reduction in the number of inward NBA transfers which went from 137 to 34. This represents the lowest number since the 2006-07 season and the main reason was the cancellation of the 2020 NBA Summer league due to COVID-19. This also caused the NBA to postpone its 2019-20 season until late summer, with regular season games played up until mid-August.


The network between the NBA and the Europe Region remained strong, accounting for more than 80% of international transfers coming from there. The Asia Region (mostly China) also maintained a major role in transfers.

The NBA G league recorded a decrease for both in and out transfers. There was a notable decrease for transfers out. The reasons for this included more teams being registered in the league (28 clubs). There was also more opportunity for players to stay in the league and better contracts - namely the 'two-way contracts' which allowed players to compete in both the NBA and NBA G League.


The WNBA recorded a decrease for both in and out transfers. There was a notable drop in inward transfers, while European countries remained the largest market for transfers.


EVOLUTION OF INTERNATIONAL TRANSFERS IN AND OUT OF NBA

REGION OF DESTINATION (2019-20)









EVOLUTION OF INTERNATIONAL TRANSFERS IN AND OUT OF WNBA



REGION OF ORIGIN (2019-20)




REGION OF DESTINATION (2019-20)




EVOLUTION OF INTERNATIONAL TRANSFERS IN AND OUT OF NBA G LEAGUE



REGION OF ORIGIN (2019-20)




REGION OF DESTINATION (2019-20)


NATIONALITY OF FIBA CERTIFIED AGENTS (2019-20)



Introduced during 2007 to secure greater professionalism, ethics and transparency, the FIBA Agent licensing system now has 548 agents officially certified. This allows them to represent players and clubs around the globe. In cooperation with FIBA and its national member federations, FIBA-certified agents continue to form an integral part of the international transfer market.

Today, a total of 11 206 representations are listed on www.fiba.basketball/agents which highlights the importance of players' agents and the need for a proper framework to regulate their activities. This contributes towards ensuring a smooth processing of international transfers and the compliance with FIBA's Internal Regulations and ethical standards.




The Basketball Arbitral Tribunal (BAT) was established in 2006 and is an organization officially recognized by FIBA. An independent body, BAT provides services for the resolution of contractual disputes between players, agents, coaches and clubs through arbitration in a simple, fast and cost-efficient manner.

Since the use of BAT to resolve contractual disputes is entirely voluntary, the failure to honor a BAT Award may entail sanctions by FIBA. These could include a monetary fine, the withdrawal of a FIBA Agent's License, a ban on international transfers of players or a ban on registration of new players, as provided in the FIBA Internal Regulations.


REQUESTS FOR ARBITRATION FILED WITH BAT

EVOLUTION SINCE 2007




AVERAGE VALUE AND ARBITRATION COSTS OF REGULAR CASES







NATIONALITY OF INTERNATIONAL PLAYERS (2019-20) - 40 NATIONALITIES




EVOLUTION OF INTERNATIONAL PLAYERS IN NBA






INTERNATIONAL VS US PLAYERS (2019-20)



FIBA REGIONS OF ORIGIN OF INTERNATIONAL PLAYERS (2019-20)







AGE PYRAMID OF INTERNATIONAL PLAYERS (2019-20)




HEIGHT PYRAMID OF INTERNATIONAL PLAYERS (2019-20)


NUMBER OF INTERNATIONAL PLAYERS DRAFTED DURING THE FIRST OR SECOND ROUND




AVERAGE AGE OF INTERNATIONAL PLAYERS AT THE DRAFT




EVOLUTION OF INTERNATIONAL PLAYERS IN WNBA






INTERNATIONAL VS US PLAYERS (2019)



FIBA REGIONS OF ORIGIN OF INTERNATIONAL PLAYERS (2019)












NATIONALITY OF INTERNATIONAL PLAYERS (2019-20) - 65 NATIONALITIES





The Basketball Champions League [BCL] is included for the fourth consecutive edition. A 50-50 joint partnership between FIBA and top European leagues, BCL was founded on a number of key pillars. These include the sporting principles of teams qualifying through their respective national competitions, the nurturing of European talent, the protection of domestic leagues, bringing coherence, transparency and unity to European club competitions, protecting the integrity of the game and treating all clubs equally to advance common interests.

European clubs continue to rely heavily on US players – both in terms of game-time and this is also reflected in the points per game totals recorded.

BCL has many more European Countries represented in it compared to Euroleague, while it also gives more opportunities to young national (domestic) players. This is demonstrated through both the percentage of players and the court time they are given.





EuroLeague Women and EuroCup Women both remained broadly similar to previous years, although one notable difference was that there was less playing time for players from the USA and more time for national (domestic) players.

There was also an increase in the percentage of National U21 players in EuroLeague Women, which shifted from 7.5% to 13.7%. However, this figure still remained low in comparison to EuroCup Women.

Both leagues continued to rely heavily on US players, with the average minutes and average points per game remaining higher than those of the national (domestic) players.
