

FIBA Players' Agents Certification Process
FIBA Players' Agents Licence

Dear Friends,

On 1 September 2006 the amended Internal Regulations of FIBA came into force including the Regulation Governing Players' Agents contained in:

BOOK 3 - Chapter IV - Articles 132 to 173 (referred to as 3-132 to 3-173) - pages 24-29

These regulations govern the activities of Players' Agents who bring about or assist in the international transfer of players or coaches. The aim of these regulations is to make sure that a high standard of quality and transparency is guaranteed for the activities of players' agents and transfers in the FIBA family.

In order to implement these Regulations, a "Certification Process" has been put in place according to which:

1. Any individual wishing to act as an agent in the international world of basketball and within the FIBA family must be licensed by FIBA with a so-called FIBA Players' Agents Licence.
2. The requirements for the granting of the Players' Agents Licence by FIBA are laid down in **Articles 3-138 to 3-152** of the Regulation Governing Players' Agents available on our webpage www.fiba.com - free downloads.

Test - in English only!

Since 2007 Tests sessions are held twice a year in the Geneva area, Switzerland, respectively in March & October. According to the demand complimentary sessions are also organised within our FIBA Americas & FIBA Oceania Regional Offices.

Costs

The administrative fee for the interview and the test is CHF 250. - (Swiss Francs) per person and paid in cash upon arrival at the test venue (exact amount in € or US \$ is accepted).

Candidates are responsible for arranging and covering their own transportation and accommodation costs. A free shuttle bus ride will be provided from Geneva airport and back at a set hour. All other individual means will be at one's own expense.

Membership Fee

An invoice of CHF 1,000 (Swiss Francs) is produced shortly after the test and sent to the successful candidate for the conclusion of his FIBA Status. A FIBA identity number is attributed for a period of 12-month as of date of payment and is renewable yearly.

Arbitration

FIBA provides to clubs, players and agents a new mechanism for the resolution of disputes through arbitration. Therefore, please study carefully the FIBA Internal Regulations – **Articles 3-289 to 3-302** - regarding the Basketball Arbitral Tribunal - BAT (formerly known as FAT) available on www.fiba.com.

Preparation for the test

The Test will consist in a multiple choice questionnaire which is based on the following extracts of the FIBA Internal Regulations governing:

- Players Agents: **Articles 3-132 to 3-173**
- Eligibility & National Status of Players: **Articles 3-1 to 3-36**
- International Transfer of Players: **Articles 3-37 to 3-100**
- Registration of Players and FIBA Players Licenses: **Articles 3-101 to 3-131**
- LoC Fee **Article 3-305**
