

FIBA Players' Agents Certification Process for FIBA Players' Agents License

Dear Friends,

On 1 September 2006 the amended Internal Regulations of FIBA came into force including the Regulation Governing Players' Agents contained in:

BOOK 3 - Chapter 9 - Articles 282 to 323 (referred to as 3-282 to 3-323)

(Pages 51-56)

These regulations govern the activities of Players' Agents who bring about or assist in the international transfer of players or coaches. The aim of these regulations is to make sure that a high standard of quality and transparency is guaranteed for the activities of players' agents and transfers in the FIBA family.

In order to implement these Regulations, a "Certification Process" has been put in place according to which:

1. Any individual wishing to act as an agent in the international world of basketball and within the FIBA family must be licensed by FIBA with a so-called FIBA Players' Agents Licence.
2. The requirements for the granting of the Players' Agents Licence by FIBA are laid down in [Articles 3-288 to 3-302](#) of the Regulation Governing Players' Agents available on our webpage www.fiba.basketball - free downloads.

Test (in English only !)

Since 2007 Tests sessions are held twice a year in Switzerland at the FIBA Headquarter. Complimentary sessions are also organised within both the FIBA Americas & the FIBA Asia/Oceania zones, according to the demand.

Costs

The administrative cost for the interview and the test is **AUD 260.00 (Australian dollars)** per applicant.

Travel & Accommodation

Candidates are responsible for arranging their own transportation and accommodation at their expense.

Membership Fee

Annual Membership fee is **CHF 1000.00** (Swiss Francs).

Arbitration

FIBA provides clubs, players and agents with a new mechanism for the resolution of disputes through arbitration. Therefore, we strongly recommend that study carefully the FIBA Internal Regulations – **Articles 3-324 to 3-337** - regarding the Basketball Arbitral Tribunal - BAT (formerly known as FAT) available on www.fiba.basketball/BAT.

Preparation for the test

The Test will consist in a multiple choice questionnaire which is based on the following extracts of the FIBA Internal Regulations governing:

- Eligibility & National Status of Players : **Articles 3-1 to 3-53**
- International Transfer of Players : **Articles 3-54 to 3-94**
- Licence of Players for Club Competitions : **Articles 3-95 to 3-112**
- Registration of Players : **Articles 3-136 to 3-149**
- Players' Agents : **Articles 3-282 to 3-323**
